

## **SANROKAN 2006**

### **A GLOBAL CONVENTION ON ECO-TOURISM**

**Theme: “Sharing Our Vision towards an Economically Empowered  
Romblon through a Sustained Eco-Tourism Industry”**

**April 6-8, 2006  
Odiongan, Romblon**

#### **I. INTRODUCTION**

##### **ROMBLON AND ITS POTENTIAL FOR ECO-TOURISM**

The province of Romblon is a cluster of 20 exotic, rugged and unspoiled islands at the center of the Philippine archipelago. It is composed of three main islands that make up the mass of Romblon’s 1355.9 square kilometer area, which is divided into 17 municipalities. Tablas, the largest island among the three has nine municipalities and where the airport is located. Mountainous and thickly forested Sibuyan Island, a natural forest reserve, is the second largest with three municipalities. Romblon, the marble island, is the third largest island, where the Provincial Capitol is situated. The rest are small islands and islets, some are inhabited with rich marine resources.

Romblon boasts of being one of the emerging eco-tourism and investment paradise in the Philippines. SANROKAN is a series of annual activities spearheaded by the Romblon Discussion List- Cultural, Livelihood, and Educational Assistance for Romblon (RDL-CLEAR) for the benefits of the people of Romblon. This is a vehicle by which the organization and its members worldwide would be able to share their expertise, time, and resources, without having to expect something in return. “Sanrokan” manifests an age-old tradition of Romblomanon and a virtue of sharing and power of unity to address crucial issues that affects the future of Romblon.

##### **RDL-CLEAR and SANROKAN 2002**

In the year 2002 RDL-CLEAR sponsored the 1<sup>st</sup> SANROKAN Convention held in the capital town of Romblon. Subsequently, annual fund raising activities were held both in Manila in 2003 and Los Angeles, USA in 2004 to support its project funding assistance programs.

SANROKAN 2006 Global Convention is a collective endeavor which focuses on the collective intent of RDL-CLEAR members to promote Romblon as an alternative tourist hub on eco-tourism. It will strive to bring together academicians, professionals, public officials, tours and travel operators, other service providers, NGOs, and other stakeholders in a collaborative

atmosphere to identify, enhance, and promote Romblon as an Eco-Tourism destination domestically and internationally.

## **II. RATIONALE**

### **Why SANROKAN 2006?**

**SANROKAN 2006 will delve on Eco-tourism to bring to the Romblomanon's attention the benefits that Eco-tourism can bring. What is Eco-tourism? The Eco-Tourism Society defines it as "environmentally responsible travel and visitation to relatively undisturbed natural areas in order to enjoy, study and appreciate nature and any accompanying cultural features that promote conservation, have a negative visitation impact and provide for substantial, beneficial active socio-economic involvement of local populations." It contributes to the local government units in a way that is economically, ecologically, and socially sustainable. It has less impact on natural resources and the environment than most other industries; provides an economic incentive to conserve and enhance natural environments and habitats; tends to have less start-up costs and continued growth into the foreseeable future; is based on enjoyment and appreciation of our local culture, built heritage, and natural environment; provides a direct and powerful motivation to protect and enhance these assets. Eco-tourism also provides for full and effective participation and viable income-generating opportunities for indigenous and local communities.**

**Our Province composed of seven (7) small islands has great potentials to become an alternative eco-tourism destination both domestically and internationally. Eco-tourism when properly planned and executed, offers an alternative that can add value to the local community, while making use of practices that help finances its indigenous culture and protecting the environment. Like in the island of Palawan, several eco-resorts make a living from practicing "high-income, low-impact" tourism- a sustainable (and profitable) break with the local fisher's tradition of dynamiting the coral.**

**All of us, whether we like it or not, are the guardians of mother earth, for our own as well as coming generations. No longer can we expect to find new travel destinations when old ones are used up or worn down.**

**Sanrokan 2006 Eco-Tourism Convention can represent a turning point when Romblon tourism shed its old ways and become greener and more eco-friendly.**

### III. SCOPE, OBJECTIVES AND EXPECTED OUTPUT

Sanrokan 2006 Global Convention on Ecotourism will feature keynotes, panel discussions, thematic workshops, lectures on success stories (case studies of Apo Reefs, Bohol, Vigan, and Palawan) and plenary session as a way forward. As part of its activities, Sanrokan 2006 will also include side events such as trade exhibits (WOW! “GALING” ROMBLON), food “KUMO” festivals, photo exhibits of Romblon’s tourist spots, Island Tours, Outdoor Sport Tournaments and Traditional Games, Cultural Shows, and a showcase of tourism information booths.

Generally, the objective of the Sanrokan 2006 Convention is to promote sustainable tourism through the sharing of knowledge, best practices and experiences in designing and managing eco-tourism projects especially in the province of Romblon.

Specifically, it intends to:

1. Assess the range of eco-tourism and sustainable tourism activities currently undergoing in the province or in the pipeline;
2. Cohesively promote established eco-tourism principles and practices in the provincial and municipal levels, respectively;
3. Encourage and promote community-based cultural and eco-tourism to help ensure that local communities benefit fully from it;
4. Foster partnerships between the local communities and national, international NGOs and tour agencies;
5. Empower local people in creating local museums and making them custodians of these Heritages;
6. Build mechanisms for collaboration of eco-tourism practitioners and proponents within the province; and finally
7. Raise the level of public awareness at provincial and local levels, especially on eco-tourism and conservation of biodiversity.

#### **EXPECTED OUTPUT**

1. A workable provincial advisory body composed of all stakeholders in collaboration with the National Agencies and LGUs to promote educational awareness among Romblomanons build partnerships and support sustainable eco-tourism practices.

2. An effective strategy for marketing and promotion of Romblon as an emerging eco-tourism destination.
3. Establish financial support mechanisms to develop and maintain ecologically-sound infrastructure (i.e. trails, waste management, waste water treatment, retirement village or housing, historical park and river walks, etc.)

#### **IV. IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY**

The implementation of the Sanrokan 2006 Global Convention on Eco-Tourism is an NGO initiative with a strong support from the Congressman, the Provincial and LGUs.

**V. EXPECTED INVITEES AND PARTICIPANTS**

**Considering that the Sanrokan 2006 is both an opportunity for the Romblomanons worldwide to touch base with their beloved province and integrate once again with their kins and relatives, expected invitees would come from expats or balikbayans and OFWs. Program design is very informative and enriching and we expect to get participants also from the**

**Academes, NGOs, People's Organizations (POs), local government units (LGUs), Provincial Government Agencies, Tourist and Resort Operators, Business Sector, Small Entrepreneurs, Tourism Councils, Cooperatives, and Indigenous Peoples (IPs). An estimated number of invitees and participants is approximately 300 persons, exclusive of resource persons, speakers, facilitators, panelists, guests and committee members and staff.**

## **VI. BUDGETARY REQUIREMENT AND ESTIMATED CASH FLOWS**

**Sanrokan 2006 Global Convention on Eco-Tourism will require an initial amount of FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P500,000.00). to defray the cost items broken down as follows:**

**16. Honorarium of Resource Persons and Facilitators**

Since the bulk of cash inflows will come from convention fees, ads solicitations, corporate sponsorships, booth rentals, sales of souvenir programs, sales of souvenir items and t-shirts, an initial mobilization fund of P200,000.00 would be needed to be deposited under a Trust Fund Account for Sanrokan 2006 which shall be opened with two signatories and one alternate signatory. Convention Fees to be charged will include food, rooms, registration packets. While it's optional, participants to join the Island Tour, etc. shall be charged individually and separately.

Projected Cash Inflows is estimated at approximately P1.5 Million and Projected Cash Outflows is approximately P1.1Million. This is not an income generating project but should there be excess funds after the Sanrokan2006, that amount will form part of the seed fund of the ECO-TOURISM PARK PROJECT to be located at Cota, Brgy. Budiong, Odiongan, Romblon.

## VIII. ESTIMATED ASSESSMENT FEES

I. CONVENTION REGISTRATION FEE- will vary depending on the status as delegates/participants.

A. Regular Delegates- those that received letters of Invitations from the Sanrokan 2006 and RDL—CLEAR.

1. Stay-In at Rencio's Resort (Ex-pats) - \$ 60.00/person (inclusive of 5 meals per day, 3 nights stay, registration packets, and convention kit & Materials) Souvenir Programs will be sold at P300/copy but free for those with paid whole page ads.

2. For Locals who wants to be billeted at Rencio's Resort – P3,000.00 Inclusive of 5 meals per day, 3 nights stay, registration packets, convention kits and materials. Souvenir Programs shall be sold at P300.00 but free for those who have paid one-whole page ads. Local participants have options to stay with their relatives and friends or stay at other available hotel rooms, pensions, boarding houses, or at RSC, or put up their own tents at Rencio's Resort.
